U.S. 401 Corridor Study:

The third round of public engagement ended on December 16, 2022. A public engagement summary report has been developed and will be posted online as part of the next round of engagement. The next steps for the study are to develop recommendations for future improvements along the corridor. The Stakeholder Oversight Team is scheduled to meet on June 21st. Public engagement to gain feedback on the recommendations is currently being planned, materials are being drafted, and is slated to begin in July/August.

Southeast Area Study Update (SEAS)

The Southeast Area Study project team has completed most of the technical analysis, and after engaging with the community, the CTT and SOT, a set of draft priorities and improvements have been developed. **Phase 2 community engagement on the draft recommendations begins this month - in June 2023.** A **public meeting is slated for June 22nd** from 5-7 p.m. at Garner's Town Hall. There is also an online survey, the project website will have the same materials from the public meeting, a promo video, and project team members will be tabling at events and locations throughout the study area through mid-July. Following engagement, the final report with all recommendations will be developed which will be shared through a third and final phase of community engagement to conclude the approximately 18-month long study. Ultimately, the Executive Board will consider "endorsing" the study for use in future transportation planning efforts, including the development of the 2055 MTP.

Wake Transit FY 2024 Work Plan Development

Public review on the TPAC Draft FY 2024 Work Plan, which was combined with the public engagement for the Wake Bus Plan recommendations, closed on March 22nd. Comments received were shared with TPAC member organizations and were considered as part of the process to develop the final, recommended plan to send to the governing boards. The Recommended FY 2024 Work Plan has been posted for public review, which closed on June 1st. A public hearing will be held at the June 21st Executive Board meeting, in advance of the Board's action on the item.

Regional Partner Projects – Public Engagement Updates

Greater Triangle Commuter Rail Feasibility Study (GoTriangle = Lead Sponsor) https://www.readyforrailnc.com/

The public comment period for the Feasibility Study report concluded in February and a summary was presented at the Joint CAMPO and DCHC MPO Boards meeting on March 29th. Each MPO has a <u>Rail</u> <u>Subcommittee</u> that have been working to identify next steps for the project that decision making organizations can take action on.

Wake Bus Plan Update (GoTriangle = Lead Sponsor) https://goforwardnc.org/bus-plans-project GoTriangle is working with regional partners to update the Wake Bus Plan which will prescribe how and when the Wake Transit Plan invests transit funds between 2025-2030. Draft recommendations were released for public review and feedback in March of 2023. That feedback has been reviewed and the project team has developed a **Recommended Wake Bus Plan Update which will be available for public review and comment from July 17-August 16, with a public hearing slated for the Ex. Board meeting on June 21st. It is anticipated that the Recommended Wake Bus Plan update will come to the Executive Board for action at their meeting on August 16, 2023.**
