CAMPO Projects – Public Engagement Updates

Cary-RTP and Gamer-Clayton Rapid Bus Extensions MIS

On April 5, 2021, CAMPO staff kicked off a major investment study (MIS) that will develop and evaluate alternatives and ultimately select preferred alternatives for rapid bus or bus rapid transit (BRT) extensions from Cary to Research Triangle Park and from Garner to Clayton. These extensions would build onto two (2) of the core BRT corridors included in the original Wake County Transit Plan. Three (3) touchpoints of community outreach are planned for each corridor throughout the study. The first community outreach touchpoint occurred throughout October of 2021 and was focused on educating the public and stakeholders on rapid bus and BRT concepts plus the study's purpose and goals while soliciting feedback on priorities for the investments to inform alternatives development and the development of an evaluation framework. The second phase, the "alternatives development and

screening" phase, is now nearing the end; the second touchpoint of community outreach occurred in April when the public was asked to weigh in on their support for various alternatives in each corridor. A summary report on the second phase of engagement will be developed and the technical project team will incorporate the feedback into development of final recommendations for the study. CAMPO's Strategic Plan Update

CAMPO embarked on an update to the 2015 CAMPO Strategic Plan. Throughout 2021, CAMPO conducted member focus groups, interviews, and online surveys as well as strategic planning retreats with the Executive Board and TCC to discuss the future direction and focus areas of the MPO. The Executive Board retreat identified both strategic and operational focus areas, including tasks to prepare for the transition into a larger planning area with increased planning area responsibilities. The TCC retreat focused on implementation strategies for these focus areas.

Since that time, staff have worked with Fountainworks to develop a set of priority tasks for these strategic and operational focus areas and create a draft strategic plan update document. This draft document will be provided to the TCC and Executive Board for review and comment. A public hearing will be held on May 18, and a public comment period will run from April 18 to May 17.

FY 2023 Wake Transit Annual Work Plan Development

The **Initial Draft** of the FY 23 Work Plan was released **by the TPAC** for public review and comment from mid-February through March 16th. Following consideration of the public input and additional analysis by the TPAC members, the committee approved a Recommended FY 23 Work Plan to submit to CAMPO and GoTriangle boards for approval. CAMPO will host a public comment period (4/29 to 5/29) and hearing (5/18) as part of Exec. Board consideration. The CAMPO Ex. Board will consider adoption on June 15; the Go Triangle BOT on June 22.

Mobility Management Program Implementation Study

This study is unique because, over the course of the study, engagement will generally be targeted to key stakeholders and organizations, individuals directly impacted by these services and any potential program, with less emphasis on the broader public. As part of the first phase, in the first part of 2022, members of the project team shared a kickoff/introductory presentation with decision-making partners and key stakeholder officials, as well as held a stakeholders workshop on April 19th.

The project team is developing plans for targeted focus groups, likely to occur in May/June, followed by the release of a draft mobility management program framework to be presented to stakeholders in the early summer.

The project team is now in the third phase of the study – Developing a Preferred Alternative. A public engagement summary report for the second phase has been developed and distributed to the Core Technical Team. At the December 8, 2021 Executive Board meeting, a motion was approved to evaluate potential alternative alignments or corridor options for the Future U.S. 401 (bypass). CAMPO staff worked with the consultant team to conduct this analysis, provided an update to the TCC and Executive Board at their meetings in March, and also received direction to proceed with a scope adjustment including an additional alignment in the analysis for the study. The study has been extended with an updated deadline of June 2023.

Following the scope updating process, the study team is now working to develop plans for additional community engagement with the goals of keeping existing stakeholders in the loop, as well as informing new stakeholders along the alignment W route about the study efforts. The next engagement phase was previously scheduled for March of 2022 and, while that has been delayed, it is currently still anticipated to occur this Spring/early summer.

Western Wake Traffic Signal System Integration Study:

This study has been technical in nature, therefore, public engagement was not part of the overall scope. However, as part of the process for the Executive Board's consideration of endorsement of the final recommendations, a public comment period will occur from June 13-July 19.

Public Engagement Planning (CAMPO)

CAMPO staff are actively engaged with public and stakeholder engagement planning for the following projects/studies.
