## CAMPO Projects – Public Engagement Updates

### 2050 MTP Final Plan Report

https://www.campo-nc.us/transportation-plan/2050-metropolitan-transportation-plan-mtp On December 8, 2021, the Executive Board approved the 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan projects and programs. The <u>Air Quality Conformity Determination Report</u> for the 2050 MTP has been released for public review and comment. The Final 2050 MTP approval includes: the socioeconomic data; the previously approved 2050 MTP/CTP projects and financial plan; goals; objectives; performance measures and targets; the air quality conformity determination; the full plan report; and the Triangle Regional Model. The full plan report has been released for public review and comment in early January, with a public hearing on January 19, 2022 and consideration of adoption by the Executive Board on February 16, 2022.

### U.S. 401 Corridor Study:

The project team is now in the third phase of the study – Developing a Preferred Alternative. A public engagement summary report for the second phase has been developed and distributed to the Core Technical Team. At the December 8, 2021 Executive Board meeting, a motion was approved to evaluate potential alternative options for the Future U.S. 401 (bypass) that are further to the south and/or east. CAMPO staff are working with the consultant team to conduct this analysis, which is anticipated to take at least a couple of months. Plans for the third phase of public engagement for the study are now being adjusted to ensure communication about the additional analysis is distributed at the same time as the third phase of engagement. Public engagement was previously scheduled for March of 2022 and, at this point, is still anticipated to occur in the Spring. The goals for the third phase of engagement are for members of the public to review and comment on the refined recommendations (preferred alternative). For the public meeting (probably an open house format), the project team is also exploring including space for other area transportation projects currently in project development with NCDOT and also local jurisdictions n the study area in order to combine public engagement opportunities. More will be shared in this public engagement update as those plans develop further.

A final report is currently under review and, therefore, one final round of public engagement – informational - on the final report of recommendations is also being planned. A public review and comment period is likely to occur in February-March, additional details will be provided to the TCC and Executive Board in the February public engagement update (this report).

#### Mobility Management Program Implementation Study

This study is in its first phase, which includes the development of a public and stakeholders engagement plan. The plan is anticipated to include both engagement of key stakeholders, existing and potential users/customers affected by the program, and the broader public. Additional details on the plan will be shared in future updates as it is developed and implemented.

#### Draft FY 2023 Wake Transit Work Plan Development

The initial Draft of the FY 23 Work Plan is anticipated to be released by the TPAC for public comment on February 9<sup>th</sup>. Following consideration of the public input and additional analysis by the TPAC members, the committee will submit a Recommended FY 23 Work Plan to CAMPO and GoTriangle for approval. CAMPO will then host a public comment period and hearing as part of Exec. Board consideration.
