<u>CAMPO Projects – Public Engagement Updates</u>

The third round of public engagement **ended on December 16, 2022**. Along with an online survey and in-person popups, Public Open Houses were held in the Town of Fuquay-Varina on Dec. 6th and in Harnett County on Dec. 8th. A public engagement summary report will be developed. The next steps for the study are to develop recommendations for future improvements along the corridor. This will include meetings with jurisdictions in the study area. **There will be another round of public engagement to gain feedback on the recommendations, likely in Spring 2023**.

Southeast Area Study Update

The project team conducted the first phase of community engagement throughout July of 2022 and a summary is available on the project website. The project team is currently focusing on technical analysis and developing a set of draft priorities and improvements, with a CTT slated for March 30 followed by an SOT meeting/update in April. Phase 2 community engagement is likely to occur in Spring 2023. Following that, final recommendations will be developed which will be shared through a third and final phase of community engagement to conclude the approximately 18-month long study.

Wake Transit FY 2024 Work Plan Development

Public review on the TPAC Draft FY 2024 Work Plan, which was combined with the public engagement for the Wake Bus Plan recommendations, closed on March 22nd. Comments received have been shared with TPAC member organizations and will be considered as the updated, Recommended FY 2024 Work Plan is finalized. A two week public comment period will occur in advance of Exec. Board action on the Recommended FY Wake Transit 2024 Work Plan, currently anticipated to occur in May or June 2023.

The public comment period for the Feasibility Study report concluded in February and a summary was presented at the Joint CAMPO and DCHC MPO Boards meeting on March 29th. Each MPO has a Commuter

Rail Subcommittee that will be meeting over the next few weeks in order to determine next steps for the project that decision making organizations can take action on.

Wake Durham Bus Plan Update (GoTriangle = Lead Sponsor)

GoTriangle is working with regional partners to update the Wake Bus Plan which will recommend how and when the Wake Transit Plan invests transit funds between 2025-2030. Draft recommendations were released for public review and feedback with a close date of March 22nd. The project team will now finalize recommendations for the TPAC to recommend to the Wake Transit Governing Boards. It is anticipated that the Recommended Wake Bus Plan update will come to the TCC and Executive Board for action in the late spring to early summer, which will include a public comment period.
