## CAMPO Projects – Public Engagement Updates

### Regional Multimodal Safety Action Plan

The Safety Action Plan has recently begun and the first round of public and stakeholder engagement will be a big one! A large stakeholders workshop was held on March 14th. Stakeholder engagement resumes in May with the formation and meetings of Technical Advisory Teams. In addition, **the first round of public engagement is currently being planned for late April-July.** Additional information will be provided soon.

### Morrisville Parkway Access Management Study

The purpose of this study is to evaluate the two-mile section of Morrisville Parkway between Davis Dr. and NC 54/Chapel Hill Road in Morrisville to make travel safer for vehicles and pedestrians. **The second phase of public involvement – sharing the proposed recommendations. The virtual project room online, presenting the study recommendations,** and an opportunity to obtain final public comments and feedback on the refined recommendations for the corridor, closed on April 7<sup>th</sup>. A summary report and final recommendations will be provided this spring.

### Southeast Area Study Update (SEAS)

This study is nearing completion. A final report of recommendations has been developed and will be shared through a community update and public comment period (April 15 to May 14), to conclude the approximately 18-month long study. **Presentations to member jurisdictions in the study area are occurring**

**now.** In June, the Executive Board will consider “endorsing” the study for use in future transportation planning efforts, including the development of the Transportation Improvement Program, and the 2055 Metropolitan Transportation Plan.

### Coordinated Public Transit Human Services Transportation Plan Update

Work on updating the Coordinated Plan is underway and engagement with stakeholders (human service and public transit providers, advocates, local jurisdictions, etc.), began in late 2023. Public engagement occurred in February -March and a public engagement summary will be available soon. Next steps are for the project team to develop recommendations in collaboration with the Mobility Coordination Committee. The recommendations will be presented to the TPAC, TCC, and Executive Board with a public review and comment period anticipated in advance of final approvals, in June or August 2024.

### North Harnett County Transit Feasibility Study

The transit study is now well underway. Educational materials are available on the project website, and the **first round of public engagement is anticipated to occur from April 12 to May 19.** Additional details will be shared with the CTT and SOT for the Study over the next few weeks. A digital toolkit will be utilized to assist with coordinated engagement across the study area. The toolkit will include communication materials, survey information, and more.

### Wake Transit Plan Update

The Wake Transit Plan Update, will include substantial public outreach and will be informed by a Core Technical Team (CTT) made up of members of the TPAC and a Stakeholder Committee made up of representatives of TPAC member agencies and jurisdictions, as well as other groups representing interested parties. **The first phase of Public Engagement will begin in May.** Additional details have been shared with Wake Transit partners and the TPAC’s Community Engagement Subcommittee. Materials have been finalized and a digital toolkit, as well as a Train-the-Trainer event, also occurred in April.

### 2055 MTP Development

Public facing development of the 2055 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP), known as “Destination 2055”, occurred from November 2023 to mid-January 2024. Working with staff from DCHC MPO and Central Pines Regional Council (CPRC), the initial phase of public engagement focused on Goals. **Presentations occurred at the Joint MPO Boards meeting in January, and at subsequent TCC and Exec. Board meetings.** A formal summary report will be posted on the project website and will help inform refinement of the goals, objectives, and elements of the alternatives analysis. For most of 2024, MTP development will be focused on data/technical modeling and scenarios for review by Executive Board Members. Staff will also be sharing educational info about the MTP with community-based organizations throughout the spring and summer. Once a few Alternative Scenarios have been developed, the next round of public engagement will occur to gain feedback on them, and on overall priorities for future transportation improvements.

## Regional Partner Projects – Public Engagement Updates

### Greater Triangle Commuter Rail Feasibility Study (GoTriangle = Lead Sponsor)

The public comment period for the Feasibility Study report concluded in February 2023 and a summary was presented at the Joint CAMPO and DCHC MPO Boards meeting on March 29<sup>th</sup>. ## Bus Rapid Transit (Raleigh = Lead Sponsor)

From November to early January, the Raleigh Project Team for the Wake BRT lines conducted a robust round of public engagement. It focused on gaining input related to the Northern BRT line, while sharing an update with the community on the Western, Southern, and New Bern BRT lines' progress.
