


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Growth Trends

Population Employment






2045 Preferred Roadway Element (*Traditional*)


Preferred Scenario Transit Element

 - Future extensions north as appropriate
 - BRT Infrastructure and Service in Capital, New Bern, Wilmington, and Western/Chatham/NC 54 corridors
 - Future service/infrastructure extensions and enhancements
 - BRT Service to midtown Raleigh
 - BRT Service in Harrison/Kildaire Farm corridor
 - Continuation of WTP frequent bus network



 - Trend based local/developer funding




2045 MTP Revenue Forecast

2045 Comparing the Impact of Traditional vs. Additional (**Preliminary** Financial)


