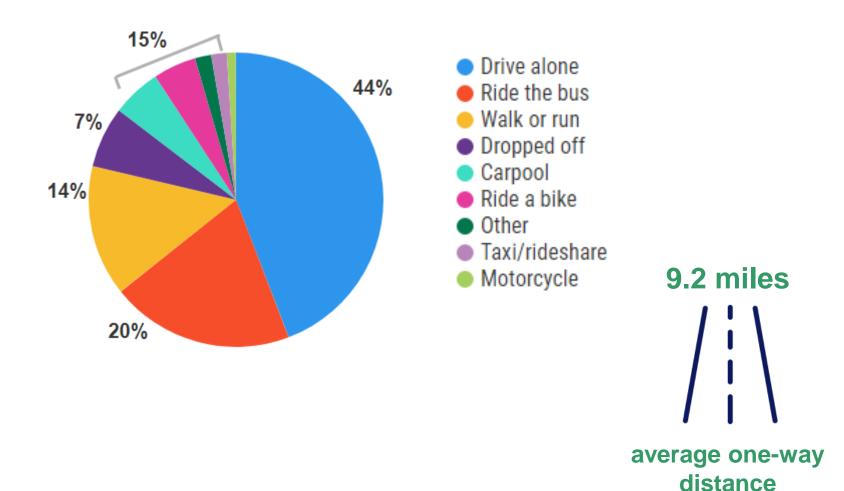
How do employees get to work?



average one-way distance

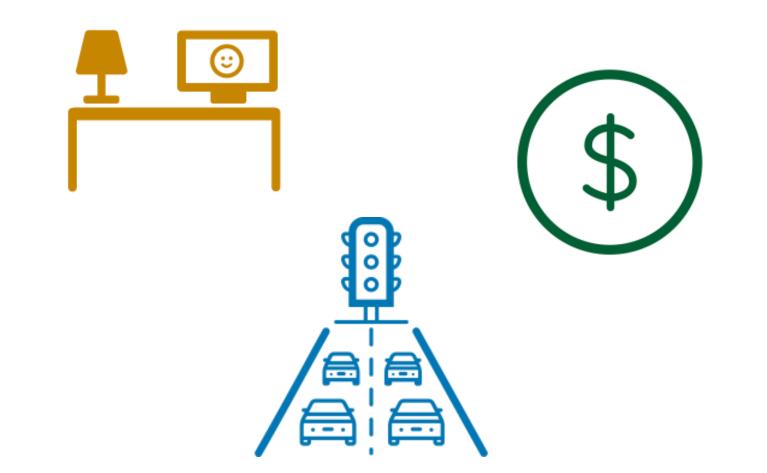


How do students get to class?

"I sometimes see people riding on busy roads and I think they're crazy to be out in traffic when there's a parallel greenway path. Maybe they don't know the greenway system?"

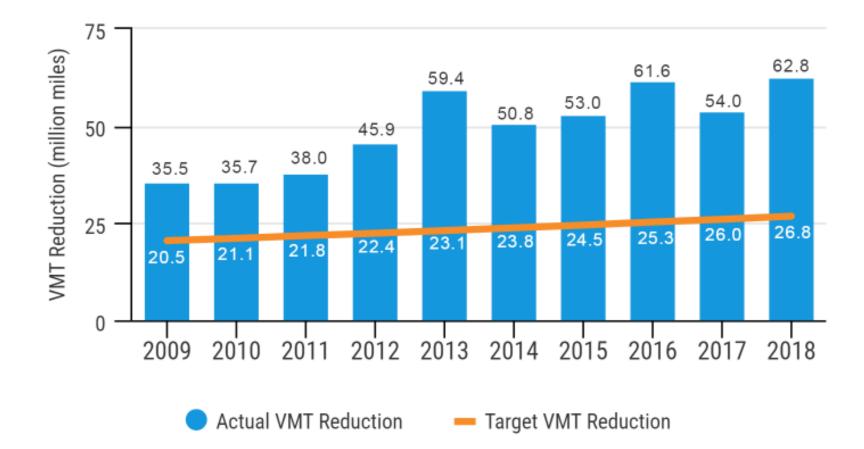

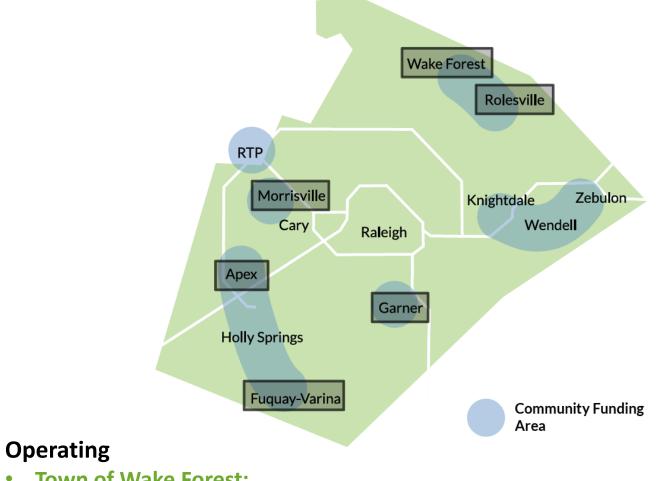

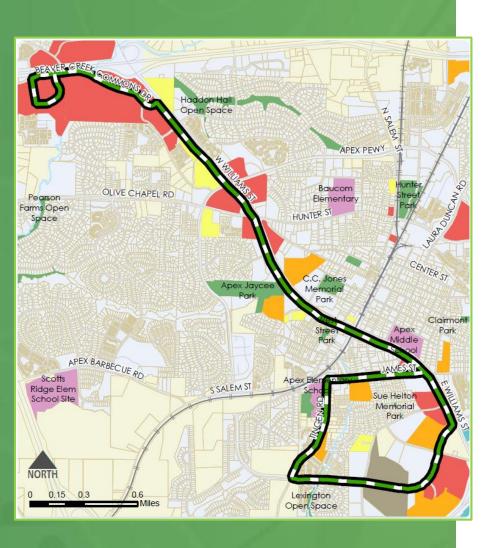


Town of Wake Forest: Reverse Circulator Loop

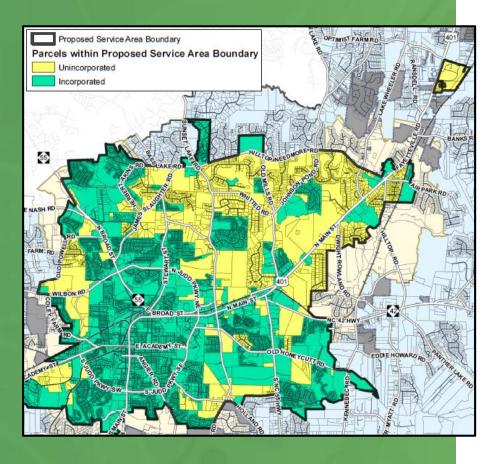

Town of Fuquay-Varina: Microtransit Feasibility Study

Project Description:

- Fuquay-Varina and Wake County will fund a planning study to determine the feasibility of microtransit service
- The study will consider if existing dial-a-ride service can be improved using microtransit technology, especially considering wait times and ride grouping efficiencies

- Demographic analysis (transit-dependent populations + location)
- Optimal service areas
- Number of vehicles
- Type/size of vehicles
- Trip frequency
- Cost (marketing, implementation, operation and drivers)

Town of Garner: Transit Planning Study

Project Description:

- Garner will hire a consultant to further investigate transit options identified in the 2018 Garner Forward Transportation Plan and CFA Market Analysis
- The study will consider a circulator loop with potential connections to routes 20/20L, future BRT/CRT service, and other potential destinations and employment centers such as the Amazon Fulfillment Center

- Analysis of transit needs and demand, including identification of origin/destination and activity centers for ridership forecasting
- Implementation plan and service mode development
- Identification of capital infrastructure needs
- Identification of potential funding options and sources
- Public outreach and stakeholder coordination

Town of Rolesville:

Comprehensive Community Transportation Study

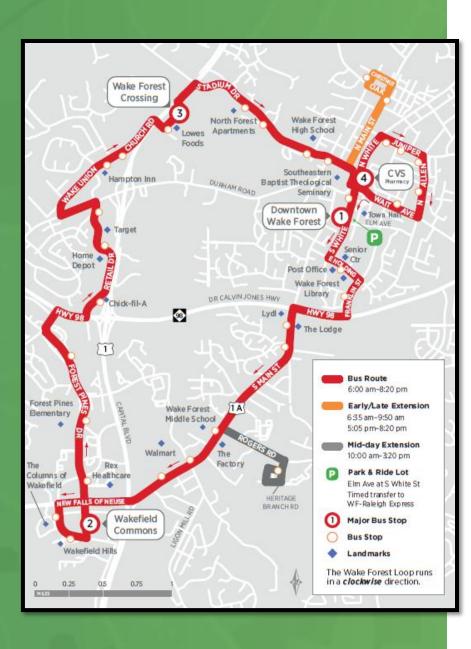
Project Description:

- Rolesville, cooperating with Wake Forest, will hire a consultant to prepare a comprehensive community transportation study, focusing on investment options discussed in the CFA Market Analysis for both communities
- The study will highlight potential connections to the Wake Forest Bus Route Loop, route 401, and/or Wake Technical Community College – North
- It will consider service modes such as:
 - partnering w/ ride-hailing companies or demand response services
 - flex route services
 - fixed route circulator services

- Analysis of existing conditions (demographics, trip generators, demand and future planning considerations)
- Development of two feasible service alternatives
- Public engagement
- Recommended service implementation / budget plan

• Wake Forest will use CFA operating funds to enhance the existing Wake Forest Loop by adding a bus running in the opposite direction

- Headway: 60 minutes for new direction of service
- Expected start of service: 1/2/2020
- Ridership on existing loop: ~32,000
- Fare free

6.3 FFY 2019 FTA Section 5307, 5340, and 5339 Distribution

- FTA FFY 2019 Full Apportionment Section 5307/5340 & 5339 funding released to the Raleigh UZA
- City of Raleigh, the designated recipient, is responsible for developing the sub-allocation of the funding for the Raleigh UZA coordinating with the partners
- Based on the 2017 MOU between the City of Raleigh, GoTriangle, the Town of Cary, Wake County and CAMPO



The 2017 MOU:

- Added CAMPO institutionalizing its role administering the calculations and concurring with the funding distribution;
- Added Wake County eligible since FFY 2017 for Raleigh UZA apportionment after reporting FFY 2015 service metrics;
- Includes Section 5339 and 5340 programs sub-allocation methodology and process;
- Includes Section 5307 low-income component of the funding formula;
- Includes Section 5307 fixed guideway tier in preparation for fixed guideway (Bus Rapid Transit) formula funds;
- Cleaned up technical language



6.3 FFY 2019 FTA Section 5307, 5340, and 5339 Distribution

Required annual funding "split letter" among transit providers

MPO must concur with the sub-allocation of UZA federal funds and the programming of projects that will make use of the funds

January 2019 – NCDOT released the DRAFT 2020-2029 STIP

• Multiple Project Delays due to project cost increases

April 2019 – two additional incidents will impact project programming

- 1. Several FY 2019 projects have been delayed and will now be included in the 2020-2029 STIP
- 2. Durham Orange Light Rail Project (DOLRT) is expected to be removed from the 2020-2029 STIP



NCDOT would like input from Capital Area MPO on programming the DRAFT 2020-2029 STIP

Scenario A: No programming changes

Scenario B:

\$60 million is programmed towards CAMPO Morrisville – Clayton BRT with ROW in 2025 and CON in 2028. Remaining \$40 million committed but in later years

Scenario C:

\$60 million to be split between CAMPO BRT and DCHC P-5716 grade separation. BRT would be committed and P-5716 would be non-committed

Review funding scenarios presented by staff and provide input to the NCDOT.



6.5 Federal Rescission Update



LAPP Goals

- 1. Develop a holistic approach to identifying and prioritizing small but highly effective transportation projects.
- 2. Utilize available funding sources in a more efficient manner.
- 3. Avoid future Federal rescissions to the maximum extent possible.
- 4. Establish an annual modal investment mix to guide locally administered investments.
- 5. Create an appropriate tracking system to monitor project status and better ensure obligation and expenditure of programmed funds.
- 6. Establish a training program for LAPP participants.

Direction From March Executive Board Meeting

- Waived \$1 million administrative approval threshold with monthly reporting at Executive Board meetings through September 30th
- Requested additional information on programming funding on shovelready projects that have been scored in previous LAPP cycles



Options for **Projects** that do not Reach Deadline

- Remove projects that do not make funding deadline from TIP. Projects may recompete for funding in future rounds of LAPP
- Reprogram existing LAPP projects that do not meet rescission deadline in a future fiscal year. Subtract outstanding balance from appropriate future LAPP cycle's programming limit

6.5 Federal Rescission Update

Requested Action:

1) Approve a strategy to protect funds from a rescission that includes

- a) programming funding on two new shovel-ready CMAQ projects that have been scored in previous LAPP cycles,
- b) allowing FY20 CMAQ projects with PE funding programmed to begin projects early, and,
- c) drawing down the remaining funding balance by retroactively applying a higher federal match to existing LAPP projects.
- 2) Request that CAMPO Staff further examine the impacts of reprogramming existing LAPP projects that do not meet rescission deadline in a future fiscal year.



6.6 FY2018-2027 Transportation Improvement Program Amendment #7

The FY2018-2027 Transportation Improvement Program has a proposed amendment. Projects in this amendment are reflective of recommended action by the CAMPO TCC to program funding on new shovel-ready projects to protect funding from a future rescission.

The public comment period for the FY2018-2027 TIP Amendment #7 will be open from April 15 to May 15. A public hearing is scheduled for the May 15 Executive Board regularly scheduled meeting.
