Wake Transit Work Plan Amendment (CAMPO Managing Process)

An amendment request falling into the major amendment category, as defined by the adopted Wake Transit Work Plan Amendment Policy, has been requested by GoTriangle for consideration by the Wake County Transit Planning Advisory Committee (TPAC). A public comment period was open until September 6. A summary of this amendment request, along with the supporting completed request form, is available here. The amendment request was considered by the TPAC at its regular meeting on September 9, 2020.

Wake Transit Bus Rapid Transit (City of Raleigh Managing Process)

Both public engagement and general communication activities will occur starting as early as September for:

- 1. Western Boulevard Corridor Study (Aug 2020 Sept 2020)
 - Virtual engagement on project updates and Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) scenarios
- 2. Wake BRT Branding (Sep 2020 December 2020)
 - On-line survey and engagement through stakeholder committee and partner agencies
- 3. Wake BRT Update for all corridors in design (October 2020 November 2020)
 - Design updates for New Bern Avenue, Southern Corridor and Western Corridor
 - System Standards, User Experience and Art Integration
