#### Harnett County Bicycle, Pedestrian Greenway Plan

Harnett County is developing a County-wide Bicycle, Pedestrian, & Greenway Master Plan to shape the development of future amenities for walking, cycling and trails. August – October will consist of online survey and two public workshops on October 6 and 7, 2020.

1. <u>Western Boulevard Corridor Study</u> (Aug 2020 – Oct 2020)

  - First phase of public engagement is complete. Raleigh City Council will receive an update at their meeting on October 20, 2020 (recording will be posted online). The next round is anticipated for later this fall.

• A <u>public survey is online</u> and open until November 6, 2020. The main goal of the current phase is to give decision-makers enough information and public input to determine whether to proceed with the project. Specifically, project partners hope to reach agreement on an initial project concept that includes station locations, a possible extension to Clayton, new train tracks, bridges, changes to the roadway network, how often the trains would run and train storage and maintenance needs.

#### Other Public Engagement *Likely* to Occur in Fall 2020
